Friends plan late summer open day

Reserve the **7th September** as the Friends of Selsdon Wood Group is planning an Open Day.

There will be guided walks by local volunteers and Ernie our conservation officer, information stands from the Friends, the RSPB, other conservation groups, refreshments and storytime for the young ones.

So why not come along and join in, or just take a walk in the woods! Starts at 12pm and admission is FREE.

If you go down to the woods today

You may or may not be aware that the habitat at Selsdon wood is home to a wide range on flora and fauna. Our main occupants are the trees of course, which range from oak, ash, maple, downy and silver birch and chestnut. Then we have the understorey of hazel, holly, hawthorn and spindle. But our most special residents are those which have been with us since ancient times, the ground flora such as bluebell, wood spurge, wood anemone, stinking iris, early purple orchid and herb paris (which you may have noticed we have adopted as the symbol of the group).

Keep an eye (or ear) out for our avian friends such as the wood pigeon, goldcrest, woodpeckers and song thrush. And if you are lucky enough, you may even spot a badger or two!

Bluebell walk rings success

Every spring the wood burst with the colour purple as an abundance of native bluebells come to life!

The bluebell walk in May was well attended by around 70 people. We were treated to an informative guided walk around the woods to appreciate the flowering sea of bluebells. The walk was lead by Ernie Thomason, our local conservation enthusiast, and supported by others from the Friends

group given the unprecedented, but welcome numbers.



Starting off from the car park, our usual meeting place for the guided walks, Ernie lead us through the wood to some of the most beautiful proliferations of

this ancient woodland indicator plant.

Wild flower sightings: July 2008

These are just a few of the 40+ species of wild flowers that were found on a recent survey at Selsdon Wood:

Shepherds Purse, Greater plantain, Common Knapweed, Oxeye Daisy, Bladder Champion, Greater Yellow Rattle, Stinging Nettle, Cow Parsley, Hogweed, Dogs Mercury, Enchanters Nightshade, Herb Bennet (Wood Avens), Hedge Woundwort, Common Sorrel, Broad-leaved, Willowherb, Greater Burdock, Bluebell, Yellow Pimpernel, Raspberry, Herb Robert, Foxglove, Nipplewort, Hoary Ragwort, Sanicle, Common Figwort, Rosebay Willowherb.....
