

**Bluebells and Anemones** – Last May I reported the rare occurrence of the Wood Anemones being out at the same time as the Bluebells. It is not so rare now as the same happened again this year - the Anemones were late and the Bluebells early so we have had the splendid sight of a blue and white carpet for a few weeks. There were many Bluebells out even in time for last month's Spring Walk (6<sup>th</sup> April) and the Anemones were really at their height then. **Hedgehogs** – Hedgehogs are endangered and there have been recent national studies to find any locations where they are still prevalent. We have never had a sighting of one in our wood - perhaps not surprising given their nocturnal habits but I am delighted to be able to report that one was spotted in a garden in Goldfinch Road in October 2017 and then again in May 2018 - see this clip from a video of the visit. Do please let us know if you have hedgehogs in your garden. (Incidentally you should never give them milk as it can cause diarrhoea - the best food to leave out for them is tinned dog or cat food, but this should not be fish-based.)



**Installation of New Seats** – Two new dedicated seats were delivered some weeks ago but we had been awaiting good surface conditions before moving them to their scheduled locations to avoid damaging the paths and fields with heavy vehicles. Now the ground has dried out and we hope to get them installed soon.
