

Brilliant Butterflies – The Brilliant Butterflies Project created a Butterfly Bank in our car park field on 19th April. This has been sown with butterfly friendly seeds and planted with 200 small plug plants of various wildflower species including birds foot trefoil and kidney vetch to supplement the chalk grassland seed mix. Many thanks to the FSW volunteers who came to help with the planting on 25th April and who are continuing to supply the plants with water. Please do not walk on the planted area and keep your dogs away until all the plants are well established. Please Take Care of the Wood – With more people using the wood litter is more of a problem. Please take your litter home and dispose of dog poo bags in the bins provided. We would also ask you to be tolerant of other users and, of course, to obey social distancing guidelines and other current Covid rules.

I spent around 40 minutes at the end of March picking up in excess of 50 poo bags that had been thrown into the brambles at the top of the car park field. It was not an easy job in deep brambles with many logs and the resulting bag full was almost too heavy for me to carry down to the bin. We have repeatedly asked the Council for a poo bin there but they have refused. The following day I put a makeshift bin at the start of the Greenhill Way path, planning to empty it myself every few days. Neale made a laminated notice for the side of the bin saying: *PLEASE, PLEASE do not throw poo bags into the undergrowth. Leave them in this bin and the FSW will empty it every couple of days. A 72 year old volunteer spent 40 minutes at the end of March clearing over 50 poo bags from where they had been thrown into the brambles. Please do not make her do that ever again!!*

The bin seems to attract an average of 15 bags per day - ie more than 100 in a week. I have reported this to the Council and asked them again to please put an official bin on that route. I'll keep you posted about their response.
