Good News - New Poo Bins – Tired of finding dog poo bags hanging on trees or thrown into bushes the FSW started a campaign in the spring of 2019 to persuade the Council to install more poo bins. This was supported by many users of the wood who lobbied the local Councillors. They were persuaded and the Council agreed to install new bins at 4 key sites - the gates at Yew Tree Way, Cascades, and Vincent Avenue and also at the exit from the car park field on Vale Border. FSW Open Day 8th September – Open Day 2019 was a combined event with the SRA Community Picnic Lunch and Fun and Games afternoon. The weather was kind to us and we had a good turnout. For the first time we had musical entertainment from the Soul Symphony Choir. Both the walk led by Ted and the Story Time were well attended. The Scouts provided a useful seating area, refreshments and some action games. The Rotary Club of Sanderstead and South Croydon (including Selsdon) helped the SRA by organising some silly races (sack races, wheelbarrow races and tomato and spoon races etc) for all age groups. Many of our regular stall holders attended - the Woodturners, Friends of Littleheath Woods, a local potter, RSPB, Girl Guides, Friends of the Earth, Croydon Beekeepers, Greenvale PTA and there was a sand paint stall as well as, of course, our own Tombola and White Elephant stall. We also welcomed a new stall - the RNLI. We hope to have more newcomers next year but need your help in publicising the availability of stall pitches. The event date for 2020 has yet to be decided but will be either 6th or 13th September. Many of the stall holders and visitors said they thought it was one of the best Open Days of the 13 we have held so we hope to keep up to that standard next year!

Extra Bat Walk - Friday 13th September 2019 - 23 people attended on a fine clear evening. Neale and Karen led a group to Leafy Grove while Ruth and Steve set up camp near the entrance to Greenhill Way and distributed a handout, with some broad information about Selsdon's bats, joining the Friends and what to do if you find a grounded bat. Common Pipistrelles, a Leisler and a Myotis bat were detected.

Meeting with LB Croydon 23rd **September** – A meeting was arranged with a number of representatives of Croydon Council to discuss the work of the FSW and establish ways of ensuring closer cooperation between us. This was attended by 6 members of FSW and 5 Council representatives. Issues under discussion were: the FSW coppicing work; the repair of the Linden Glade pool; benches and seats in the wood; path cutting in fields and woodland areas; and maintenance of, and access to, the toilet block. It was agreed that FSW and LBC should continue to meet and work together to conserve the wood.
