



Gate Repair – We are delighted to report that the gate from the car park to the field that has been broken for a couple of months has now been repaired by the council.

Other Work by Council Contractors – Coppicing and clearance work is currently under way at the bottom of The Wend where a chainsaw has been at work for the past fortnight. Much of the thin scrub has been cut down and the area will presumably be replanted, probably with Hazel.

Last Month's Walk – Autumn Trees and Fungi on Saturday November 2nd

– This walk combined the usual autumn leaves walk with the fungus hunt which was cancelled last month. Eleven people were in the group who managed to find a dry period between showers. A wide variety of fungi were seen (amongst them 3 species new to us this year) and a full report with photographs and list is published on the website. Amongst the autumn fruits and leaves we spotted Spindle berries in Greenhill Way and another splendid berry display on the female Holly in Linden Glade. Photos show the startlingly coloured Green Elfcup and strangely shaped Pipe Club Fungus.

FSW Winter Work Programme – Our main work this winter will be a continuation of the coppicing at the top of Langford's Way.. However, we will also clear any path blockages that may be caused by winter storms and hope to do some further clearance in the gorses area. We are discovering that many of the posts attached to the old deer fence in our coppice area have rotted at the base and will have to be replaced. To assist with this we hope to buy a post driver (cost approximately £50).

On the workday in early November, a new volunteer brought along his 8 year old son whose sharp eyes spotted a vole amongst the leaves. When held in his gloved hand it settled down to preen its fur. It was released safely out of the work area.

We look forward to keeping up the good work in 2020. Do please join us!!!
