Workdays – Our winter workday schedule of 2 meetings per month is now over and for the next 5 months we shall meet only once each month. With the sap rising coppicing activities have ceased and most of our work will involve tidying and clearing paths and around the benches. The Friends have also recently painted the new gate at the Cascades entrance and fitted a bolt to make it easier to open from the inside.

Last Month's Walks – Our Spring Walk on Saturday April 7th was attended by 20 people. The weather was cool and overcast but at least it wasn't raining! The first open bluebell of the year was spotted along with many spring flowers including: Dog Violet, Wood Anemone, Barren Strawberry, Lesser Periwinkle, Lesser Celandine, Dandelion, Primrose, Dogs Mercury, Violet Ivy-leaved Speedwell, Hairy Bittercress, Common Daisy and Red Dead Nettle. Blossom was also seen on the Bullace, Blackthorn and Wild Cherry.

Ten days later, on Tuesday April 17th we led a walk for a Caterham University of the 3rd Age Flora and Fauna group. We met them at the car park at 10.30am on a lovely spring-like day and followed a walk similar to that of April 7th. The Bluebells had come on considerably in the intervening 10 days although the Anemones were still at their height and fully open in the sunshine. Cowslips in F2 and Wood Sorrel in East Gorse had opened since the 7th but there were no other additions. During the walk the visitors had a whip round - and at its conclusion they gave us £25 as a donation to the FSW - a delightful surprise! ©
