Winter Workdays – In the winter season we have two workdays per month to get through the tasks that are best completed when nature is dormant. Some of the tasks we have identified for the coming season are listed below. We can always use more help so if you are interested and have some time to spare on the first and last Sundays of the month do please get in touch.

- 1. Replace fallen path signs and put up the new bat box near the existing one.
- 2. Investigate and repair, if possible, the broken axle on one of the trolleys.
- 3. Clear the small fallen trees in Pool Grove.
- 4. Clear the small tree growth blocking the entrance to Jubilee Plantation.
- 5. Remove trees leaning over The Wend and Langford's Way.
- 6. Clear bramble, bracken & sycamore in Middle Gorse (the photo shows a workday in this area in January 2018).
- 7. Clear bramble in the old coppice area at the top of Langford's Way to allow coppicing to restart, and mark the three Wild Service trees if they still survive. Also remove bramble in the area next door where we planted Elm and Wild Service trees.
- 8. Reorganise the toolstore and sharpen tools.
- 9. Consider replacing missing carpark posts.
- 10. Plant saplings. (These were donated by Claire Butcher who received 5 complimentary saplings from the Woodland Trust as part of the Queen's Commonwealth Canopy initiative. She contacted us to ask if we would like them for Selsdon Wood,)
- 11. If coppicing restarts re-plant with hazel whips (to be ordered from Simon Levy).
- 12. Repairs to the pond liner.
- 13. Consider cutting back regrowth on the holly we cut last winter and treating the stumps.



Forthcoming workdays are on November 4th and 25th and December 2nd.
